Rules of Competition

- All animals must have been the bona fide property of the Exhibitor from 31st May 2025 (PLEASE NOTE: this rule does not apply to the Horse Section)
- 2. Members Badge/s and ticket/s WILL BE SENT to Exhibitors after the closing date for entries. All Horse and Cattle numbers are to be collected from the Secretary's Office on the day of the Show. Fleece numbers shall be posted to Exhibitors.
- 3. Entries for all animals intended for Competition must be received by the Secretary NO LATER THAN FRIDAY 6th JUNE 2025.
- 4. Unless otherwise stated on the Schedule, judging commences at 9.00am.
- 5. Bulls must be led by a ring in the nose, otherwise they may not be allowed to compete. All other animals should be led by a bridle or halter, except Cross Cattle, which may be penned

loose.

- 6. All animals must be in the Show field by 8.30am and will receive their numbers at the Stockbox. Thereafter, they must occupy their pens until 3pm. Exhibitors themselves will be responsible for having their animals in the pens allocated to them.
- 7. Exhibitors are responsible for completing their own Sheep and Goat movement documents. One to Caithness Show and one returning home. Both completed documents should be sent to SAMU within 3 days of the movement.
- 8. All cows in calf or all 2-year-old pure bred heifers must have a calf at foot or have calved within 9 months from date of entry, failing which the prize money may be withheld or returned to the Secretary.
- 9. The judge may withdraw or award prize tickets where only one of each class is shown as merit may appear to deserve. In this respect or in anything else concerned with the judging, the Judge's Decision is Final.
- 10. All NCC Sheep exhibited in the show must have been clipped according to the Rules of the NCC Sheep Society.
- 11. Animals shown in pairs or groups cannot be shown individually except in the group of 3 cross cattle and classes 12, 13, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 60, 61, 68, 69 & 70.
- 12. All Border Leicester Sheep shown at the Show must have been clipped bare and an official certificate to this effect must be obtained from the Caithness BL inspectors and be submitted with the entry form. Bare clipped is taken to mean that there is no more than 1 inch of wool on any part of the body at date of inspection which must be on or after 1st May 2025.
- 13. Competitors themselves will be liable for any damage by or to themselves, their employees, or their stock during the whole time they are on the Show field.
- 14. When not other especially mentioned, trophies must be won 3 times in succession before becoming the absolute property of the winner.
- 15. In the riding and driving competitions, the Sports Committee will have full power to prohibit any competitor in taking part in these competitions if they consider such desirable without giving any reason, and in the same way, they may remove such a competitor from the Ring.
- 16. No protest will be received unless lodged in writing with the Secretary, either on show day where that is possible, or within 1 (one) week from the date of the Show where the information in which the protest is based does not come within the protestors knowledge until after the show is over.

- 17. All protests shall be brought before the Management Committee as soon as practical after being lodged, and their decision will be final. A meeting of the Management Committee will be held within one month after the show to settle all matters connected with the Show.
- 18. All exhibitors are responsible for the accuracy of their own entries and any exhibits in the opinion of the Show Committee that has knowingly made a false entry shall be liable to forfeit all premiums awarded to them and shall, if the Society so decide, be disqualified from competing again.
- 19. Horses may not be left unattended tied to stabs.
- 20. No animal can compete in more than one class on the same day with the exception of Rule 11. <u>WITH EXCEPTION TO HORSES</u>: Any Horse is now eligible to enter 2 classes in any section (apart from the WORKING HUNTER & SHOW JUMPING SECTON which is 1 class per horse) which they are eligible to enter, but if the classes clash the exhibitor shall have to decide which one, they wish to exhibit in (i.e., a Ridden and an In Hand may).
- 21. Rig Sheep will not be allowed to compete in the male sheep classes.
- Parade of stock will take place at 1.45pm and attendants must be beside their stock at least 30 minutes before that time to be ready to take their animals into the ring when called upon to do so.
- 23. All Stockmen are requested to wear white coats for the parade on show day.
- 24. Attendants in charge of stock must have a Stock Attendants Ticket before they will be allowed free access to the Show.
- 25. All sheep that win their Section/Group (i.e., Suffolk etc.) must be presented for Judging for Overall Sheep, the same applies for the Groups, or they will not be eligible to collect trophies.
- 26. Straps must be worn on Riding Hats (all ages) for safety reasons.
- 27. Cattle Parade Any exhibitor under 16 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.
- 28. All horse lorries must have a pin in the towing eye to allow for efficient movement of the vehicle where towing is required.
- 29. All animals entered in the Caithness Show must be in good health. No animal suffering from any contagious disease will be allowed on the showground. The veterinary surgeon's decision will be final.
- 30. The committee recommends that all horses and ponies attending the Caithness Show should have a current Equine Flu vaccination. Horses and ponies attending the Caithness Show, do so entirely at the owners' risk.

- 31. Rabbit Exhibitors Rabbit Haemorrhagic Disease (VHD c+v) RHD2. Please note that rabbits should have immunological cover against RHD both classical and the variant (RHD2).
- 32. Feather Section Please note that all keepers of birds must be registered with the Scottish Kept Bird Register, evidence of this must be produced before entry to the Show. All poultry keepers must confirm that birds do not originate from premises or areas which are under restrictions related to confirmation of notifiable avian disease, including from any disease control zone imposed by Ministers or premises within an Avian Influenza Prevention Zone.

TROPHY WINNERS NOT ATTENDING THE PARADE ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO COLLECT TROPHIES. NO LATE ENTRIES ACCEPTED ON THE SHOW COMMITTEES' DECISION. ALL ENTRY MONEY MUST BE PAID AT THE TIME OF ENTRY. NO ENTRIES TAKEN AFTER FRIDAY 6th JUNE 2025.

Wool Competition

- 1. Fleeces shall be laid out in the Wool Marquee by 9.00am on Show Day.
- 2. Each Fleece shall be appraised, and the Judges Scorecard fixed above each entry.
- 3. Points shall be awarded for style, character, uniformity of quality, strength, springiness, colour, fibre, fineness and particularly an overriding factor.
- 4. Any artificially tinted or stained fleeces shall be disqualified.

Shetland Pony

Shetland Pony Stud Book Society Rules (Affiliated Shows)

Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.

Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.

To enter a stallion in any class (in-hand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPSBS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPSBS Voluntary Veterinary Examination.

Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions oft w o years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a stallion bridle disc which are available to purchase from the SPSBS.

There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats of the current safety standard must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted and take no further part.
