RULES

All entries for competition must be in the marquee **by 12.30pm** on Friday 17th July 2026. All exhibits **MUST REMAIN UNTIL 4.30pm on Saturday 18th July 2026**. None but the Flower Show Committee will be admitted to the marquee while exhibits are being judged.

Competition labels must be obtained from the Stewards, one for each entry. These labels bearing name and home address of the individual competitor, section and class of entry must be securely attached to each exhibit. It is not sufficient to place labels under vases. Children's age to be shown on label. NOTE: The name and address will be sealed during judging.

Competitors must provide themselves with the necessary vases etc. with which to display their entries.

Pot Plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for 2 months.

All Cut Flowers entries must have been grown by the exhibitor.

A Night Watchman will be on duty but the Society shall not be held responsible for any damage done to vases, stands, pots etc. of competitors or for the loss of these.

Prize money will be awarded in all classes.

50p entrance fee will be charged per exhibit in all classes, excluding the Children's Section.

Novice Section is open to competitors who have not previously been placed in the Open Floral Arrangement Section, Intermediate Section or been placed first in the Novice Class.

Intermediate Section is open to competitors who have not been placed in the Open Floral Art Section or placed first in the Intermediate Section.

Accessories allowed where stated. Dimensions will be strictly adhered to. Fresh flowers to be used unless otherwise stated.

Competitors may enter more than one exhibit in each class.

Should any questions arise on which these rules are silent, this should be submitted before the Flower Show Committee whose decision shall be final.
